WHO WE ARE

Founded in 2014, and working in close collaboration with and with support from the Embassy of Ireland in Malawi, the Malawi Irish Consortium on Gender-Based Violence (MICGBV) brings together humanitarian, development, human rights, legal, advocacy, and gender-focused organisations committed to advancing gender equality and strengthening GBV prevention and response in Malawi. The consortium currently comprises six member organisations: ActionAid Malawi, Concern Worldwide, Irish Rule of Law International, Oxfam in Malawi, Self-Help Africa, and Trócaire.

The MICGBV promotes evidence-based programming on gender equality and gender-based violence and supports the work of the Government of Malawi, particularly the Ministry of Gender, Children, Disability and Social Welfare, along with other key stakeholders engaged in GBV prevention and response.
